

The 2017 Capital City Farmers Market was an overwhelming success. We partnered with Capital School District and their "Chef Senators" truck to offer free lunches to kids 18 and younger. For every customer that made a purchase, they received a raffle ticket for a weekly drawing to win a gift certificate from one of our local merchants. We offered many children's activities such as yoga, karate, story time, arts & crafts, food demonstrations, horticultural education and fire safety. We also introduce our new "Lunch & Learn" series for the adults.
